How to enter:-

1. To enter the **Potato and Plant Challenges**, collect seed potato and/or plant plug from the Village Hall between 10am and noon on **Saturday 5th March**. There will be a charge of 50p.
2. Prior to the show select the classes you wish to enter and fill in the attached form (inside back cover) or print from the Burstall website. There is a charge of 30p for each exhibit entered except for the children's classes (Divisions 7, 8 & 9) which are free.
3. Deliver the form plus entry fee cash or cheque to the Post Box in the Clock Tower at the Village Hall IP8 3DR by **5pm on the Wednesday before the show**. Cheques to be made payable to Burstall Village Club, no cheques under £5 please. Or email form to annfdays@gmail.com. BACS entry fee to: Burstall Village Club: Account number 02632374: Sort code 30-94-55. Please put Flower Show in the reference.
4. **Late entries, ie those not made by the Wednesday before the show, will be charged at a rate of 50p each on show day.**
5. **On the day of the show bring your entries to the marquee between 8 and 10am.** (Judging begins at 10.30am and everybody must have left the marquee by then).
6. On arrival at the marquee collect your exhibitors' cards and place your entries in the appropriate area with the card under the entry. (Please ask if you need help).
7. The marquee will be open to visitors from 1 pm until 4.30pm. Please remove your entries after this time. If you wish to donate them to the show auction, please make it known by using the stickers supplied.
8. Trophies will be presented at 4.45pm. Prize money may be collected from the show treasurer in the marquee from 4.15pm. Monies not collected on show day will be returned to the show funds.

Show Rules:-

- Judging is according to the Royal Horticultural Society Rules and the decisions of the judges are final. Any person using any means to deceive the judges will forfeit all prizes and be debarred from entering future shows.
- **Flower and vegetable entries must have been grown by the exhibitor for at least two months prior to the show**, although flowers may be purchased for the flower arranging classes (Division 3).
- Handicraft items must have been made by the exhibitor and must not have been entered previously.
- All baked items should be on paper plates, in a clear plastic bag (no cling film please).
- Preserves must be in non-commercial jars and have new lids.
- Only one entry per person in each class is allowed.

The Burstall Horticultural Society, the Cranfield Memorial Trust, the Burstall Village Hall, Fiske Lands Trust and Fiske Farms, their officers and employees will not be responsible for or accountable to any person whatsoever for any damage or loss to the property of any person whatsoever or for any accident or injury, fatal or otherwise or any damage or loss that may occur to any person or animal or vehicle whilst upon the showground or car parks or whilst entering or leaving the same. Acceptance of the foregoing provisions shall be a condition of entry.

1. 3 Runner Beans
2. 3 French Beans
3. 3 Carrots with tops trimmed to 75mm/3 in approx.
4. 3 Potatoes same variety
5. 3 Onions with tops trimmed and tied
6. 3 Spring Onions with roots washed and foliage intact.
7. 3 Beetroot (tops trimmed 75mm/3" approx)
8. 1 Lettuce (any type)
9. 1 Cabbage (pointed or round)
10. 3 Courgettes (50mm/6" approx)
11. 3 Tomatoes
12. 1 Cucumber
13. Dish/Plate of 10 Soft Fruit (ie Blackberry, Raspberry, Gooseberry or Strawberry)
14. 3 Sticks Rhubarb with foliage trimmed to 75mm/3" approx.
15. Potato Challenge! Potatoes grown in a bag/bucket, seed potato supplied, please see additional note

16. 3 Stems of Annuals (all the same)
17. 1 Rose Bloom
18. Vase of Mixed Garden Flowers (no more than 10 stems)
19. A Foliage House Plant of your choice
20. 1 vase of Sweet Peas (6 stems) foliage may be included for effect
21. 1 Hydrangea head
22. A bunch of Lavender
23. 1 Pot-grown flowering plant in bloom
24. 1 bowl of Floating Flower Heads
25. Collection of Herbs in a jam jar

Chocolate Brownie (See class 43)

275g soft margarine
375g caster sugar
4 eggs
1 teaspoon baking powder
75g cocoa powder
100g plain flour
100g plain chocolate drops or chips – add last

Preheat oven to 190c, fan 160-170c, gas mark 5.

- Grease and line a baking tin 11 x 7 inches
- Put all the ingredients except the chocolate chips into a bowl and mix well until blended.
- Add the chocolate chips and then turn the mixture into the prepared tin and level the top.
- Cook in preheated oven for 40-45 minutes
- Cool in the tin and cut into squares to serve.
- Makes about 32 pieces.

Almond Tarts (See class 45)

Shortcrust pastry made from 150g flour (Makes18)
3 tablespoons raspberry jam
75g butter
75g castor sugar
1 egg
75g ground almonds
25g plain flour
25g semolina
Few drops almond essence
2 tablespoons milk
Icing sugar to decorate

Perheat the oven to 190c. Fan 170c. Gas mark 5

- Roll out the pastry and use to line a 12 hole bun /patty tin (the ingredients should make another 6)
- Place a teaspoon of jam in each pastry case.
- Place butter and sugar in a bowl and cream until light and fluffy
- Beat in the egg and then fold in the remaining ingredients
- Divide the mixture between the pastry cases and smooth the tops.(Remember you should be able to make 18 in total)
- Bake for 20 mins . Cool before dusting with icing sugar.

Sensory Cuff (See class 50)

Required: Size 6 or 8 knitting needles

A selection of wools from Dk, cotton or super fine

A selection of trimmings eg. ribbon, buttons, name tags, pom pom trim, felt and poppers

- Cast on 70 stitches
- Knit 16 rows of rib in DK wool
- Row 17 change colour and knit for 6 rows
- Row 23 change colour and knit 16 stitches in stocking stitch
- Row 39 change colour and knit 3 rows (Note you could insert eyelets if you wish to insert ribbon)
- Row 42 purl
- Row 43 knit
- Row 44 purl
- Row 45 knit
- Row 46 knit
- Row 47 change colour and knit the next 16 rows in stocking stitch
- Row 63 and 64 knit a contrasting colour in DK
- Row 65 change colour and knit 5 rows in stocking stitch
- Row 70 continue in the same colour and knit for 14 rows
- Row 84 knit
- Row 85 purl
- Row 86 knit
- Row 87 purl
- Row 88 change colour and knit in rib 6 rows
- Row 94 change colour and knit for 8 rows
- Row 102 change colour and continue in stocking stitch for the next 6 rows
- Row 108 change colour and continue in rib for 8 rows
- Cast off.

Sew up the long sides and then sew on the trimmings very securely
